

SENATE NO. 1560

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE RETIREMENT BENEFITS OF CERTAIN PUBLIC SAFETY EMPLOYEES

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled,
And by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Subdivision (3) of section 21 of Chapter 32, as amended by section 1 of chapter 17
2 of the acts of 1997, is hereby further amended by inserting after paragraph (f) the following
3 paragraph:

4 (g) the review and analysis of information required under section twenty-six A as it relates to
5 the employees contribution rate changes and benefit changes under said section 26A. Such
6 analysis shall focus on the contributions made by members and the normal cost of benefit, plus
7 any other liabilities determined by the actuary to be a result of such benefit changes under said
8 section 26A. Beginning January first, two thousand and four and every five years thereafter, the
9 actuary shall forward to the respective system such analysis.

10 SECTION 2. Subdivision (1) of section 22 of chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby
11 amended by striking out paragraph (b) as amended by section 176 of chapter 151 of the acts of
12 1996, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-

13 (b) The treasurer or other disbursing officer in charge of payroll in any governmental unit to
14 which a system pertains, and the treasurer or other disbursing officer in charge of payrolls in
15 any free public library the employees of which are eligible for membership in a system, shall,
16 upon written notice from the board, withhold on each pay day five per cent of the regular
17 compensation of each employee who is a member in service of the system, which is received on
18 such day by such member on account of service rendered to him on or after January 1, 1946,
19 and not later than the date on his attaining the maximum age for his group, in the case of an
20 employees who entered the service of the commonwealth or a political subdivision thereof prior
21 to January 1, 1975; withhold on each pay day seven per cent of the regular compensation of
22 each employee who is a member in service of the system, which is received on such day by such
23 member on account of service rendered by him on or after January 1, 1975, and not later than
24 the date of his attaining the maximum age for his group, in the case of an employee who entered
25 the service of the commonwealth or a political subdivision thereof on or after January 1, 1975,
26 but prior to January 1, 1984; and withhold on each pay day eight per cent of the regular
27 compensation of each employee who is a member in service of the system, which is received on
28 such day by such member on account of service rendered by him on or after January 1, 1984,
29 and not later than the date of his attaining the maximum age for his group in the case of an
30 employee who entered the service of the commonwealth or a political subdivision thereof on or
31 after January 1, 1984, but before July 1, 1996; and withhold on each pay day nine per cent of
32 the regular compensation of each employee who is a member in service of the system, which is
33 received on such day by such member on account of service rendered by him on or after July 1,
34 1996, and not later than the date of his attaining the maximum age for his group in the case of
35 an employee who entered the service of the commonwealth or a political subdivision thereof on

36 or after July 1, 1996; and withhold on each pay day twelve per cent of the regular compensation
37 of each employee who is a member of the state police appointed pursuant to section 10 of
38 chapter 22C, and is a member in service of the system, which is received on such day by such
39 member on account of service rendered by him on or after July 1, 1996, and not later than the
40 date of his attaining the maximum age for his group in the case of such employee who entered
41 the service of said state police on or after July 1, 1996; and withhold on each pay day twelve per
42 cent of the regular compensation of each employee who is eligible to receive benefits provided
43 for pursuant to section 26A; provided, however, that in the case of any teacher such withholding
44 shall be made upon written notice from the school committee, board of trustees or other
45 employing authority, to the treasurer or other disbursing officer of the political subdivision by
46 which such teacher is employed.

47 SECTION 3. Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section
48 twenty-six the following section:-

49 Section 26A. (1) As used in this section, the following words shall, unless the context otherwise
50 requires, have the following meanings:-

51 “Public Safety Officer” a probation officer; or trial court officer; or a police officer; or a
52 corrections officer; or a firefighter; or an environmental police officer.

53 (2) Any public safety officer employed as of the effective date of this act shall be retired by the
54 appropriate retirement board upon his attaining age sixty-five; provided that any such public
55 safety officer who has performed service as a public safety officer for not less than twenty years
56 but including creditable service granted by paragraph (h) of subdivision (1) of section four and

57 who has not attained the age of sixty-five may elect to retire pursuant to the provisions of this
58 subdivision.

59 Any public safety officer employed after the effective date of this act shall be retired by the
60 appropriate retirement board upon his attaining age sixty-five; provided that any such public
61 safety officer who has performed service as a public safety officer for not less than twenty years
62 but including creditable service granted by paragraph (h) of subdivision (1) of section four and
63 who has not attained the age of sixty-five shall be retired pursuant to the provisions of this
64 subdivision.

65 (3) Upon retirement under the provisions of this subdivision, a member shall receive a
66 retirement allowance to become effective on the date of his retirement. Payments under such
67 retirement allowance shall be made as provided for in sections twelve and thirteen and the
68 normal yearly amount thereof shall be equal to sixty percent of the average annual rate of his
69 regular compensation received by such member during any period of three consecutive years of
70 creditable service for which such rate of compensation was the highest, or on the average annual
71 rate of regular compensation received by such member during the period or periods, whether
72 consecutive or not, constituting his last three years of creditable service preceding his
73 retirement, whichever is the greater, provided, that the total amount of the allowance shall be
74 increased by one-twelfth of three percent for each full month of service in excess of twenty
75 years of service; provided, however, that such retirement allowance shall in no case exceed
76 seventy-five percent of such regular compensation. Any such member retired under the
77 provision of this subdivision who is a veteran as defined in section one shall receive an
78 additional retirement allowance of fifteen dollars for each year of creditable service or fraction

79 thereof; provided, that the total amount of said additional retirement allowance shall not exceed
80 three hundred dollars in any case.

81 (4) Any provision of sections one to twenty-eight, inclusive, which are inconsistent with any
82 provision of this section, shall not apply to any member so classified under this section;
83 provided however that any member with less than twenty years of creditable service as a public
84 safety officer upon retirement shall be retired in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (a)
85 and (b) of subdivision (2) of section five of chapter 32, and subject to the limitation set forth in
86 paragraphs (c) and (d) of said subdivision (2), and shall be based on such member's age and
87 number of years and full months of creditable service on the date the retirement allowance
88 become effective.

89 (5) The actuary, acting under the provisions of paragraph (g) of subdivision (3) of section
90 twenty one, shall require each board to obtain certain information from each member eligible
91 for the retirement benefit under this section, including the name, date of birth, prior contribution
92 rate, date of hire and any other information required by the actuary for the purposes of the report
93 required under said paragraph (g).

94 SECTION 4. Any member of a retirement system who meets the definition of public safety
95 officer as defined by section twenty-six A of chapter thirty-two on the effective date of this act
96 may elect in writing to participate in the alternative public safety retirement benefit provided
97 under said section twenty-six A within two hundred and seventy days of the date this act takes
98 effect. Any such election shall become effective on the first day of pay period next following
99 such election, and shall constitute a waiver of any retirement benefits provided under section
100 five or section ten of chapter thirty-two. Any member making such an election shall be required

101 to make a minimum of three years' of retirement contributions at the rate of twelve percent;
102 provided, however that if said member chooses to retire before he has made said three years of
103 contributions at twelve percent, said member shall pay into the annuity savings fund or have
104 deducted from his retirement allowance an amount equal to the contributions that would have
105 been made had such member remained in service for three years at the rate of regular
106 compensation from which he retired. The election by an eligible member to participate in the
107 alternative public safety retirement benefit provided for under said section twenty-six A shall be
108 irrevocable.

109 SECTION 5. The additional contributions required under paragraph (b1/2) of subdivision (1) of
110 section 22 shall not apply to any public safety officer as defined by section twenty-six A of said
111 chapter thirty-two.
